Canon Niall writes.....

Welcome to this week's newsletter. Our First Reading today comes from the New Testament 'Acts of the Apostles' as is the custom during Eastertide. It shows how St Barnabas welcomed the new Christian convert, Saul of Tarsus, later to be known as 'St Paul' to the Christian Community. Saul had tried to destroy Christianity before he, himself, encountered the Risen Christ on the road to Damascus. This encounter changed Saul forever, he embraced the faith he had tried to destroy. Some were suspicious of Saul, but Barnabas took it on himself to support Saul, and it was his perseverance that helped people see that Saul had changed, helping share his story of how he had encountered Jesus. Saul, writing under the Roman version of his name, 'Paulus', Paul, was to become one of the greatest saints in the Christian story, St Paul. It was possible through Barnabas' support. Paul was in the forefront, Barnabas took on a more supportive role. Sometimes people's role can be to support and enable others to perform their role; this Barnabas did for Paul. In today's Gospel Jesus uses the image of the vine, from which branches grow and spread from the main root, and in turn root and give rise to other branches. Jesus is teaching us that 'rooted' in him only can we grow and pass on the life we receive and bear the 'fruit' of our relationship with him. I thank God today for all the people who have been like St Barnabas' to others, and with them bear the fruit of the Gospel today

Prayer to the Holy Spirit – please pray this prayer every day

Come O Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth. O, God, who taught the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit, grant that by the gift of the same Spirit we may be always truly wise and ever rejoice in his consolation.

We ask this through Christ, our Lord. Amen".

We will contact those we know about, but if anyone feels they might like to help with this role to speak to one of Clergy after Mass and we can then get arrangements made for meetings to prepare for this.
