Canon Niall writes.....

Welcome to this week's newsletter. In the edited version of our First Reading from the New Testament 'Acts of the Apostles, St Peter in his meeting with the Roman Centurion (Captain), Cornelius and his household, who though not of the Jewish faith, had experienced the gift of living faith in Jesus, St Peter has to remove his 'blinkers' that limit his vision of God, and see with God's vision and then encourages others to share this vision. Both the Second Reading and Gospel are on the theme of 'God is Love'. That seems a nice, almost obvious thing to say in a church setting! But when we stop to think and reflect, it is truly awesome! We take the cue from the line in the Gospel: "A man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends." God's love, value and worth for each of us was not just an idea 'out there' somewhere; it became a person in Jesus. It shows that God sees each of us, and longs for us to be free and flourish to be those people we have been created to be. We see in our world today, people divided, put into 'this' or 'that' category, often by those who seek to promote their own agendas and ends. As we come together in the Eucharist and in prayer, it constantly calls us to remove any 'blinkers' that limit our vision of God, and then seeing more clearly in God's way, we also can help make Jesus' message not just an idea 'out there' but a real and living message, as today's Gospel says: "What I command you is to love one another"

Prayer to the Holy Spirit – please pray this prayer every day

Come O Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth. O, God, who taught the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit, grant that by the gift of the same Spirit we may be always truly wise and ever rejoice in his consolation.

Through Christ Our Lord. Amen.

St Michael's Old Presbytery: Work is restoring the Old Presbytery at St Michael's is coming to completion, but it will a short while yet until the building is ready for use again.

Changes to the Abortion Law and the threat of abortion up to birth: Members of Parliament will be voting on Wednesday, 15th May on two amendments to reduce the limit of abortion time from 24 to 22 weeks, and another amendment to reduce the abortion time limit for babies with Down's syndrome to the same as other babies. At present abortion for Down's syndrome babies is up to birth. Also MP's will have the opportunity to vote on two amendments that will generally give the right to abortion up to birth.
