Welcome to this week's newsletter. The Old Testament Reading today comes from the second book of Kings and has the image of Elisha the prophet meeting a great need with something small given in trust. The same image is found in the Gospel of John where Jesus takes something small, again offered in faith, and makes it fill a huge need in the 'feeding of the five thousand'. The Second Reading from St Paul's Letter to the Ephesians reminds us that we are called each to play our part in building up the Body of Christ. Together it calls to mind that there is not one of us, no matter who we are, no matter what our situation that cannot make a difference. Even if what we have to offer may seem small and insignificant, if it is given to God in faith and trust, like the small offerings made in the scriptures today, it can contribute to meeting a great need. Many will now know that Bridget Philomena Bresnihan, Faithful Companion of Jesus, known to all as Sr Breda FCJ died on the morning of Tuesday 16th July in Arrowe Park Hospital, having been admitted following a brief period being cared for at Nazareth House. The wisdom and insight of Sr. Breda as she offering spiritual guidance and prayers with many at Heathbank, will be missed in the parish. Arrangements are being made for her funeral to take place here at St Joseph's followed by burial in the grounds of Upton Hall, where she served for a number of years as a member of the teaching staff. Please

pray for the repose of her soul and for the whole FCJ community as they give thanks to the Lord for the gifts and talents with which he bestowed her. Sister Breda's Funeral Mass will be this Tuesday, 30th July, 2.00pm at St Joseph's. All are Welcome. May she rest in peace.

Deanery Support: This weekend with Father Michael Coughlan in Lourdes, Father Sam will be covering Masses in St Paul's, Beechwood and Our Lady's in Cavendish Street. From Thursday, 1st August Father Mario who looks after St Anne's, Rock Ferry and St John's, New Ferry will be going home to Nigeria for a month's holiday, and so myself, Father Sam and Father Michael, when he is back, will help cover Father Mario's Churches during this time. We will also be offering occasional cover to Father Ramesh and Father Praveen in Wallasey. Again, this is a time when we help each other as a local Church.

Welcome to Seminarian William Muh Ngong: Last week we welcomed Seminarian William Muh Ngong, and said farewell to Seminarian Johnson Edeh. William is from Cameroon, the country next to Nigeria where Johnson comes from. William is in a similar situation as Johnson. He completed most of his training for the priesthood in a Religious Order in Cameroon, Nigeria and Spain and other countries. Like Johnson, William already holds the ministry of Acolyte. With Johnson he had a time of discernment at Shrewsbury Cathedral before spending the last few months on a placement at Our Lady's, Shaw Heath, Stockport. William is going with Johnson for the same 'bespoke' year at Oscott, and he too will hopefully be ordained to the Diaconate and Priesthood soon. Whilst William is at Oscott for this year, Bishop Mark has asked that he have a 'home base' with us at St Joseph's Presbytery; among other things this will give William experience of another part of the Diocese. Whilst he will not be on a formal placement as such, he will be with us during College holidays, he will assist us as he can. William is very welcome and we look forward to his time with us.

<u>Diocesan Pilgrimage in Lourdes this weekend:</u> Our Diocese of Shrewsbury Pilgrimage is running from last Thursday, 25th July to Thursday, 1st August. We join in prayer with them that this time will bring great blessing to our whole Diocesan family.

Reintroduction of the opportunity to receive from the **Chalice:** Thank you to all who came to the gathering for Eucharistic Ministers recently. We decided that from August we will reintroduce the opportunity to receive Holy Communion in both kinds, under the forms of bread and wine. Whether we receive Holy Communion just under the form of bread, or just under the form of wine, we are receiving the fullness of Christ, but the sign of receiving this gift is fuller when we can receive both the host and the chalice. It has been a gap of a few years now since due to COVID we gave Holy Communion only under the form of bread. Now receiving from the Chalice again is gradually being reintroduced as people feel comfortable. As before, receiving from the Chalice is optional, and our reintroduction will be a gentle process for people to adopt only should they feel comfortable. We will write and say more about this closer the time.

<u>Candle Stands:</u> We are trialling these 'St Killian's' Stands in both our Churches. Just a reminder, please place the wax candle cone in the glass cup and then light it with the lighter provided. Please do not light the wax cone candle before putting it into the cup. The figure of '£1' is only a suggestion; whatever you are comfortable paying is fine.

St Killian's Stands Maintenance Training: Denise from St Killian's is coming this Thursday, 1st of August to demonstrate the maintenance of these stands. She will come to St Joseph's at 11.00am and then to St Michael's at 12.noon. If anyone involved in Church cleaning and maintenance is available to come this would be a great help.

Marriage Preparation: If you intend getting married in the Parish in the next 18 months the church asks that you attend a Marriage Preparation Course before your marriage can take place. We are offering two days here in the Parish to be held in the Hazlehurst Room at St Joseph's Presbytery, the first on 14th September 2024 and the second on the 15th February 2025. Please contact the Parish Office if you wish to register or speak initially with one of the clergy.

Summer Party Over a 100 people spent an enjoyable afternoon at the Summer Party last Sunday, and raised an amazing total of £1,900.41 towards parish funds. Many thanks to those who so generously supported this event, either by being there, sending a donation or helping in any way at all to organise the afternoon. I would like to thank everyone who has kindly donated wool to me, so I can keep knitting blanket squares, my third blanket is nearly finished and hopefully a fourth one will be completed by the charity's next trip in September. PUMA (PUMA have a Facebook page) have recently returned from Ukraine where they distributed an articulated lorry full of aid the Children's Hospital that was recently damaged, to two shelters for displaced people, a Church near the front line that distributes aid to displaced families and to the frontline itself, to name just a few groups they have helped. 
