Canon Niall writes.....

Welcome to this week's newsletter. In our First Reading today from the Old Testament Book of Deuteronomy we hear the words of the 'Shema', a central prayer of the Jewish people, and fundamental to their understanding of God, and their way of living that faith, *"Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God is the one Lord. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength"*. In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus adds to this: *"You must love your neighbour as yourself"*. This was a constant theme of Jesus' teaching, that you can recite all the words nicely, but if there is no 'heart' behind them it misses the point. A Religious Teacher genuinely asks Jesus about the 'Law' the 'Torah' of Moses, and what command is greatest. Jesus sums it up in the 'Love' of God that translates into how you treat others 'your neighbour'. In a time in our world when we are so aware of the 'coldness' inhumanity' of the way people treat each other, we are reminded that as we are renewed in God's tender, compassionate love, we in our turn are called to pass that on by our attitude, way of life and example, so that through us the warmth of that love can touch hearts, and be a source of hope and new beginning

Prayer to the Holy Spirit – please pray this prayer every day

Come O Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth. O, God, who taught the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit, grant that by the gift of the same Spirit we may be always truly wise and ever rejoice in his consolation. Through Christ Our Lord. Amen.

Middle East Humanitarian Appeal - CAFOD: The Disasters Emergency Committee (DEC) have launched an emergency appeal in response to the worsening crisis that we see in the Holy Land. CAFOD is a member of the DEC. Thanks to the support of the Catholic Community here in England and Wales, they have already been supporting partners providing essential and life-saving responses to the huge need in Gaza to many thousands of people over the last year and have been able to allocate £60,000 out of core funds to Lebanon partners to support their immediate response. Sister Catherine FCJ: On Sunday 24th November the 9.30 Mass will be offered in thanksgiving for the service Sr Catherine FCJ has given in teaching and as our Parish Sister over some 40 years. Many of you will know that she is moving to start a new community house in Salford with four other companions. Sr. Catherine will be the last Faithful Companion of Jesus living and working in the Diocese.

Livestream at St Michael's: We are very aware that the Livestream at St Michael's has been down for a good period of time, and we are very sorry about this. This is not a problem with the Livestream itself, but with the Wifi connection on the whole St Michael's Site, which has turned out to be a very complicated issue. We are working as best we can to get a solution as promptly as possible. This Wifi fault also affects the Contactless Donations Tablet.

Children's Liturgy at St Joseph's and St Michael': In the next few weeks we hope to be in a position to reintroduce Children's Liturgy at St Joseph's and St Michael's. As soon as we have definite dates we will let you know.

St Michael's Old Presbytery : The work to repair the flood damage is now completed and in the immediate days coming we are working to get the building ready for use again. Hopefully this will not be much longer.

LIVERPOOL WELSH CHORAL present: Fauré: Requiem and Gounod: Saint Cecilia Mass, Christ Church Port Sunlight, Saturday 9th November - Just six months after filling Liverpool Anglican Cathedral for a stunningly dramatic performance of Verdi's Requiem, Liverpool Welsh Choral come to the Wirral to perform two very different Mass settings, both by French composers. Instead of the thunderous Dies Irae of the Verdi Requiem, Fauré's Requiem includes hauntingly beautiful settings of the Pie Jesu and In Paradisum. Rather than equating death with judgement, and retribution, Fauré viewed death as: 'a happy deliverance, an aspiration towards happiness above, rather than as a painful experience' The Fauré is preceded by Gounod's Saint Cecilia Mass, a little known but charming work, appropriately performed in the month when we celebrate the feast of St Cecilia, patron saint of Music. A number of singers from the Wirral sing with Liverpool Welsh Choral, described by one reviewer as 'simply dynamic!'. They deserve to be heard!
