Canon Niall writes.....

Welcome to this week's newsletter. On this Second Sunday of Advent we always have the image of John the Baptist and the message to 'Prepare in the Wilderness a way for the coming of our God'. 'The Wilderness' in 'Bible Speak' is a place that symbolises desertion, desolation, danger, neediness; a place of dryness and emptiness, where people there would need help and support to survive. In Jesus' time the Wilderness would be a place for outcasts or those on the edge of society. There is a 'joy' in today's message that the wilderness is where God is going to come to make a new way; not where everything is perceived to be ordered, neat and under people's control, but where there is most need, where those who are in most need of help is where God promises to build the new way. Perhaps when the world around us may seem disordered and desolate it is here where God reminds us once again that he wishes to come anew, transform and make a new way. In all the 'wildernesses' that have surrounded us recently there has been real hope in the generous, selfless acts of so many. Today the Baptist's words are not just a nice idea, but something real and living that we can all share in making a living reality

Come O Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth. O, God, who taught the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit, grant that by the gift of the same Spirit we may be always truly wise and ever rejoice in his consolation.
