### Canon Niall writes.....

Welcome to this week's newsletter. We have moved back to the Church's 'Ordinary Time' which will take us to the Seasons of Lent and Eastertide, and then recontinues after the completion of the Easter Season at Pentecost. However, the Gospel of this Sunday, St John's account of the Wedding at Cana, has an Echo of Christmastide! It is the third traditional 'Epiphany' scene. The word 'Epiphany' means 'to show forth' to allow something to be seen for what it truly is. The first of these scenes is the visit of the wise men, then thirty years later, the Baptism of the Lord, and then today, the Wedding at Cana. A family who are not too well off have invited Jesus, his mother and disciples to the Wedding and celebration. They start to run out of wine and face severe embarrassment. Jesus' mother Mary intervenes and asks Jesus' help; Jesus initially appears to refuse, but Mary believes in him "do whatever he tells you" she says to the stewards. Jesus tells the steward to draw the water which has turned to wine. Jesus never sought the role of 'wonderworker' or 'magician' he sought to 'show forth' the way of God 'the kingdom of God' among us. His 'miracles' are a sign of that kingdom. In today's Gospel Jesus is 'shown forth' in an ordinary human celebration 'among us'. Mary, perhaps representing the whole Church, intercedes and Jesus helps turn what could have been a disaster into a celebration; his disciples 'believe in him'. The Church, with Mary and the Saints, still intercede, and Jesus can still turn 'disasters' into 'celebration' if we also 'believe' in him, knowing that he is among us still

#### Prayer to the Holy Spirit – please pray this prayer every day

Come O Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth. O, God, who taught the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit, grant that by the gift of the same Spirit we may be always truly wise and ever rejoice in his consolation. Through Christ Our Lord. Amen.

First Holy Communion: The children of the parish have now enrolled on their program of preparation for their First Forgiveness and Holy Communion. Please keep them in your prayers as they grow in their love for the Lord. Help and encourage them whenever you see them and pray also for their parents and teachers as examples of faith for them.

<u>Crib Offerings:</u> As we move into the New Year the Christmas Decorations in our Churches have been taken down, and thanks to all who prepared them, and saw to their being taken down. The Cribs, in accordance with tradition, will stay in place until the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in early February. There are still baskets by the Cribs in both our Churches for the Annual 'Crib Offerings' which go to 'Caritas, Diocese of Shrewsbury' the name for the group that now incorporates what was the 'Catholic Children's Society'. 'Caritas' seeks to bring support to the most vulnerable families and peoples in the community, so do please support them as you are able.

<u>Acolyte William Muh Ngong:</u> It is good to have Acolyte William Muh Ngong, with us for a little while longer whilst he is on his January placement.
