Canon Niall writes.....

Welcome to this week's newsletter. This weekend the scriptures remind us to build on what matters, not on what is passing. The Gospel reading from St Luke this weekend is his version of 'The Beatitudes'; those values that will be revealed in the life of a follower of Jesus. St Luke speaks of 'the rich' and 'the poor'. It is a picture not so much about those who have, or have not, material wealth, but people's 'attitude of heart'. 'The rich' spoken of in the Gospel have an attitude of heart that feels they have everything they need, but in fact have no 'treasure in heaven'. 'The poor' are those who know that all they have and are is a gift of God and persevere to do right. This is prefigured in the First Reading from the Old Testament prophet Jeremiah, who warns people again about who or what they put their trust in; they will only flourish when they are rooted in God. St Paul reminds us in the letter to the Corinthians that if we don't really believe that Jesus is risen from the dead, then all we do is meaningless and outward show, but professing and believing his resurrection we are sharing in the very life of God. As we move into this 'Jubilee Year 2025', we seek once again to be re-rooted in those values of the Gospel that endure into eternal life

Prayer to the Holy Spirit – please pray this prayer every day

Come O Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth. O, God, who taught the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit, grant that by the gift of the same Spirit we may be always truly wise and ever rejoice in his consolation.
