Canon Niall writes.....

Welcome to this week's newsletter. The message of this weekend's scriptures is to build, not on what passes, but what endures forever. The short passage from the Old Testament book of Ecclesiastes, reminds us that all we labour for in this life must in the end be left for others after we have gone. Jesus took up this theme in the Gospel in the parable of the rich man, who trusted in his own wealth and power to see him through, and that he had 'control' over his life. In the parable God says "Fool! This night your soul is required of you, and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?" In the parable the 'rich' man had not made himself rich in the sight of God. We make ourselves 'rich' in the sight of God when we share selflessly God's love, mercy, peace, tenderness, compassion, respect, reconciliation, hope and Good News. These are God's 'treasures'; these are treasures that we can give, share and never grow poorer, but grow richer in God's sight the more generously we share them. In our world of today, near and far, God's treasures are as needed now as ever; the 'Good News' today is that those treasures are part of us, and we take heart that in sharing and living them we help each other to grow ever richer in the sight of God!

Prayer to the Holy Spirit – please pray this prayer every day

Come O Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth. O, God, who taught the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit, grant that by the gift of the same Spirit we may be always truly wise and ever rejoice in his consolation. Shrewsbury Diocesan Lourdes Pilgrimage last week:

We welcome back all those who went on our Diocesan Jubilee Pilgrimage to Lourdes, last week with the theme 'With Mary, Pilgrims of Hope'. There were almost 430 pilgrims this year, which is the biggest number since covid. While they were in Lourdes the pilgrimage intentions were:

- For peace in the world
- For every human life to be held sacred
- For the new evangelisation of our country and for the increasing number of young adults seeking faith and Baptism
- For our new Holy Father, Pope Leo, in his supreme apostolic ministry
- For the renewal of our local church by new and generous vocations especially to Marriage as the foundation of the family; to the Priesthood, the vocation on which all other vocations depend; to the Permanent Diaconate in its generous service; to the Consecrated Life of women and men in its radiant witness; and for the apostolic life and apostolate in the midst of the world

We pray that these intentions will bear fruit, and as our pilgrims return our whole Diocesan family will be blessed and encouraged in our mission to 'magnify the Lord' today

<u>Churches Together:</u> In Saint Joseph's church we are praying this week for those in the following roads: Edinburgh Drive, Elm Rd North, Heswall Ave, Highgreen Rd, Hillside Rd, Holborn Hill, Durley Park Close.

During the summer months, a time when we are warned of hosepipe bans and drought, we are reminded how something as basic as water straight from a tap is taken for granted. There are many areas of the world where water is still drawn from wells as well as dirty rivers and lakes for drinking and cooking. WATER AID helps by drilling village wells and installing pipes to community village taps to supply clean running water for the villagers. At the back of church at St Joseph's during August and St Michaels during September the parish Justice and Peace group have placed a Well and tap display and we encourage you to donate in the Well to support the work of Water Aid.

<u>Foodbank:</u> Please remember there is a continuing need for food. Please leave your donations at the back Church, many thanks.


