Canon Niall writes.....

Welcome to this week's newsletter. This weekend the Twenty Fourth Sunday is displaced by the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross. We so familiar with the 'Cross' and 'Crucifix' as Christian Symbols, that we can actually forget what the 'Cross' was; it was used as a brutal form of execution, a terrible way to end the life of another human being Jesus had been proclaimed as 'the Messiah', the anointed one of God, and yet to the mentality of the time, someone undergoing Roman Crucifixion, would disprove this claim, vindicate almost those who had criticised and denounced Jesus. Yet not long after this the first followers of Jesus were proclaiming boldly Jesus' death on the Cross, and the Cross as our hope. This would have been totally mad unless they had experienced Jesus' Resurrection. He was the 'Crucified and Risen Lord' and had suffered the path of death, but not bound by it, had risen from death, and transformed that path into a way to new life. The 'Exaltation of the Cross' reminds us that what the world would consider 'failure' is transformed by God into a path of new life and beginning. When we feel there is no hope, or any way forward, this Feast gives us hope 'Save us, Saviour of the world, for by your Cross and Resurrection you have set us free'

Prayer to the Holy Spirit – please pray this prayer every day

Come O Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth. O, God, who taught the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit, grant that by the gift of the same Spirit we may be always truly wise and ever rejoice in his consolation.

The Holy 'Jubilee' Year:

We continue the 'Jubilee Year' or 'Holy Year' of Hope 2025 inaugurated by Pope Francis and continuing with Pope Leo, to share with our world, and make present in our lives, the loving heart of Christ

Welcome to Father Sijo Poulose (Maniparambil): Last Saturday we welcomed Father Sijo Poulose, whose family name is Maniparambil from Kerala, in India. After we knew Father Sleeva was going back to India, a request came from the Syro-Malabar Bishop in the UK for us to accommodate Father Sijo, as we did for Father Febin. Father Sijo is now living with us at St Joseph's Presbytery. Father Sijo, who has newly arrived from India, will be serving as the Chaplain for the Syro-Malabar Catholic Rite Community on the Wirral, Chester and occasionally North Wales. Whilst he will be involved with his ministry across these areas, he may be in a position to help us here from time to time celebrating Mass in our Roman Rite. This will unfold in time, but for the present we are pleased to welcome Father Sijo among us.

Syro-Malabar Catholic Rite: A reminder about what we mean by the Syro-Malabar Rite. There was a myth that before the Second Vatican Council in the 1960's every Catholic Mass throughout the world was celebrated in Latin; this was not actually the case. Whilst the larger number of Catholics are part of the 'Roman' or 'Latin' Rite, other 'Rites' exist within the wider Catholic Church. A 'Rite' in the Catholic Church describes the way and language Liturgical Celebrations are carried out, but also the hierarchy and governance of these groups. The Syro-Malabar Catholic Rite originates from India and takes its roots from the 'St Thomas Christians', in a tradition from about AD 50 when St Thomas the Apostle, or some of his immediate followers, established a Christian Mission in India. The Syro-Malabar Rite has been an autonomous Rite within the Catholic Church since 1662 and has its own hierarchy and liturgical rites whilst being part of the Catholic Church in Communion with the Pope. With a greater number of Syro-Malabar Catholics now being in this country there is a Bishop, Mar Joseph Srampickal, based in Preston, to oversee the Syro-Malabar Church in Great Britain. There is also a Ukrainian Greek Catholic Bishop, Kenneth Nowaskowski, based in London who oversees the Ukrainian Greek Catholics in Britain. Having Father Sijo with us reminds us that we are part of a great Catholic Family across the world.

Support for the Deanery and wider area: This September, we are supporting some of our neighbouring Birkenhead and Wallasey Parishes whilst clergy are away. This weekend Father Michael and I are covering Holy Apostles and Martyrs' Parish in Wallasey whilst Father Sam Thotamala is on holiday in India for the next month or so. So if you are not seeing us for periods of time, this is what we are doing!
